A visit from the Police













On 8th December, Red Room was visited by two special quests—PC Tyrone and PC Louise. They came to speak to the children about the importance of keeping safe. They explained why it is important to stay close to their parents when out and about in the local neighbourhood, such as in the supermarket, at the park, or during outings.

They also talked to the children about why they should never approach large dogs or speak to strangers. The officers explained how children can recognise a police officer by their uniform, and what they should do if they ever get lost in a supermarket—stay inside the shop and look for someone wearing a store uniform or a security badge.

Finally, the officers reminded the children not to play near busy roads. The children then sang their road safety song, "Stop, Look and Listen."

After the talk, the police officers allowed the children to try on their hats and pretend to be police officers. The children also had the chance to sit in the police car and talk about the sounds it makes. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the visit, listening to the story, and learning about how to keep themselves safe, as every child has the right to be safe.
